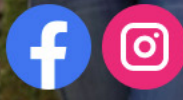

Halloween in Oak Park

Official trick-or-treating hours are typically 4 to 8 p.m. on October 31.

Households not participating in trick-or-treat are encouraged to turn off their lights or post a No Trick-or-Treating sign on their door to discourage unwanted visits. Conversely, households that are accepting trick-or-treaters can post a Trick-or-Treaters Welcome sign indicating trick-or-treaters are welcome.
